Camp Program Overview:

This year’s theme is “SPACE CAMP.” Some of the exciting activities planned are Archery, BB’s, Sports, Woodworking, Crafts, Games, Nature, Skills, Skits, Songs, and, not to mention, our plans to just have FUN!!!

Programs Dates and Time:

June 15-19, 2009
 Monday- Thursday 8:30am – 3:00pm
 Friday 8:30am – 1:00pm

TIGER CAMP is on Thursday and Friday.

Campers are to arrive 15 minutes prior to start time. Camp Staff are to arrive 7:30am and depart at 4:30pm each day.

Fees:

Tiger	\$40.00 (Thursday and Friday only)

Camp fees include a camp T-shirt, snack each day, an event patch and provides for the use of our camp facilities, special program guests, event and program equipment.

Discount: If you have a 2nd Scout you may receive a \$15.00 discount off second Scouts fee or if you volunteer for the full week you may receive a \$40.00 discount. You may only receive one discount, they may not be combined.

Camp Location:

Camp will be held at the Coats Baptist Church, (Hwy 55) 554 N, McKinley St. Coats, NC 27521 in Harnett County.

Eligibility and Transportation:

To participate in Cub Scout Day Camp, a boy must be registered with a Cub Scout Pack. This includes boys who are just beginning as Tiger Cubs (as of June 1). No person or groups will be excluded because of race, color, national origin, or hardship for participation in Cub Scout Day Camp. Transportation to and from camp is the parent’s responsibility.

Camp Uniform:

Each camp participant is required to wear an official camp T-shirt everyday with shorts/pants and tennis shoes. No open-toed shoes will be allowed. Each camper will need to bring swimming trunks, sandals or water shoes, and a towel on Friday Fun Day.

Medication:

Each attendee must bring any medication, including inhalers and epipens, which need to be given at camp. Upon arrival at camp, all medications will be turned into the camp nurse. Minor children will transport no medications.

Lunches, Snacks and Drinks:

Each Camp Attendee, Volunteer, Den Leader and Staff Member is responsible for providing his or her own nonperishable lunch and drink everyday except Friday. It is advised that each camper put their healthy lunch inside of a labeled, one gallon zip lock baggie with a frozen drink inside to help keep their lunch cool. The camp will provide snacks, beverage and water each day.

Friday Family Fun Day:

Friday will be Family Fun Day. This event will include meal and refreshments and will conclude with our awards ceremony. Parents and siblings are encouraged to attend. Day Camp will provide the drinks and main dish. A letter will go out on the Monday of camp to let you know if your camper will need to bring anything on Fun Day. Family Fun Day will be over at 1:00pm.

Kids Korral:

The "Kids Korral" provides a Day Camp experience with activities for young *children of Staff members, Den Leaders and parent volunteers*. In order for a child to attend Kids Korral, *a parent MUST be in camp* while they attend. We do not provide day care for Scout siblings. In addition, each attendee must be toilet trained or other arrangements made.

Tiger Program:

Our camp has an exciting program for incoming Tiger Cubs in order to introduce them to the fun of both Cub Scout Day Camp and Scouting. Tigers are invited to attend Thursday and Friday camp activities. Any incoming Tiger who registers for camp **needs to have an adult partner accompany them every day**. Incoming Tigers must also complete a BSA Cub Scout registration form. Contact your local Pack or call Occoneechee Council (919) 872-4884.

Volunteers:

Our camp is staffed with volunteers and without adequate parental assistance our camp could not function. No experience is necessary and there are a wide variety of positions that need to be filled. Volunteering your time, even if its just one day, will allow you to reap the benefits of a great program and have fun with an awesome group of boys. Come join the fun and excitement! To find out about volunteer opportunities available, please contact the Camp Director.

Camp Aides:

Boy Scouts of any age & older siblings, who are at least 14 years of age, are invited to volunteer as Camp Aides. Service hours will be recorded and a letter providing proof of service will be given at the end of each camp session. If an adult attends camp on Staff for the week, older siblings, between the ages of 11 and 14 years may also assist their parent as a Camp Aide.

Den Leaders, Volunteers and Staff Members:

All camp Den Leaders, Volunteers and Staff Members are required to attend a Camp Leader training session prior to camp. The time and location will be announced at a later date. This training is mandatory for our national standards and accreditation. In addition, each adult must also have taken **Youth Protection Training**. Youth Protection Training may be taken online at www.scouting.org or in a classroom setting (check the Occoneechee Council web site at www.ocscouts.org for a training schedule).

Registration, Camper-ships and Refunds:

Anyone interested in attending camp must submit a complete registration form and health form. Fees must also be paid in full with the completed registration form. Full and partial camper-ships are available for families with financial hardships. Please contact our District Executive, Christopher Newton at (919)872-4884 for more information about financial assistance. Early registration must be received by May 18, 2009 all others should be sent no later than June 8, 2009.

Behavior Contract

While we recognize that children need discipline at some point and time, a Scout who consistently requires disciplinary action creates an environment that is not enjoyable and potentially unsafe for himself and others.
